

## Directions to walk to the Black Bull Inn from Hunting Hall

*It is a lovely walk of less than two miles along a grassy bridleway to The Black Bull Inn.*

Walk out of the farm and down the hill.

At the bottom of the hill there is an area of grass with a cherry tree in a wooden tree surround. Turn left here along a grassy bridleway. This track leads over an old ruined bridge and up a hill.

*In Medieval times, this was the main road to Holy Island for anyone travelling from the South. They would follow the Roman Road into Lowick and then branch off at the crossroads along this old lane. Many monks and pilgrims would travel this route.*

At the top of this tree-lined track continue straight ahead up the public bridleway on the right-hand side of the hedge.

Walk straight on along the side of two fields until you get to the end of the second field where there is a fence with a small wicket gate.

Go through the wicket gate and continue along the grassy fenced bridleway.

At the next wicket gate bear left and follow this stony track past the new farm sheds and eventually onto a hard road.

Turn left onto the road and walk a little way until you see a public footpath sign on the right hand side. Take this footpath along the back of the village (I think it's called Church Lane).

The lane passes the churchyard on your left where there is a newly made gap in the wall. Turn left into the churchyard, skirt around the church and down the church path onto the main street. You are directly opposite the Black Bull.
